## **Why Should I Stay at the Host Hotel for the Dash?**

In a discussion about the Dash back at the October meeting, I offered an explanation regarding the importance of using the contracted host hotel for the Dash. Part of my job responsibility is meeting planning and I work with hotels and resorts across the state. I wanted to share some information that perhaps many people are not aware of.



Hotels are in business to fill their beds. In any contract negotiation, that will be their main concern. The more rooms they can fill, the more concessions they will make to the group who wants to put together a contract for an event. Many hotels will give free space for meetings/dinners etc. based on how many guest rooms are filled. The Copa Cabana has given us the room that we use for our registration at no cost because we are helping them sell the guest rooms. The club also has the use of the parking lot where we hold the show, again at no additional charge. The cost of the rooms that each person who stays at the Copa pays helps to defray the cost that they would otherwise charge the club for use of the registration room and the parking lot. That makes it pretty important for our group to use the host hotel so that the club isn't charged a big bill for show expenses or worse for unfilled rooms under the contract.

#### **Another thought....**

Herein lies our problem with trying to move the show to another Dells (or most any other) hotel. The ones that have the capacity to accommodate our group, will most likely have their own restaurant, and require us to use their catering. In my experience, it is unlikely that we would be able to provide a lunch for less than \$9-10 per person using the catering service, which is about three times what we are paying to do our own catering now.

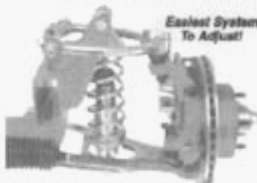

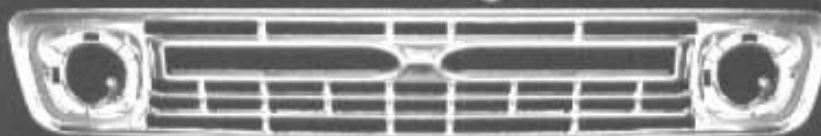

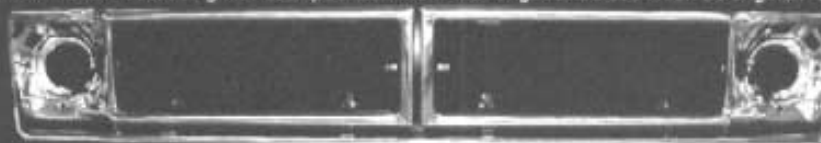

**ARTICLE IV- Club Officers**

Section B - Duties of the President shall be as follows:

1. Conduct all general meetings.
2. Attend all general meetings.
3. Present all new business.
4. Submit monthly article for newsletter.
5. Right and power to speak for the Club on small matters.

Section C – Duties of the Vice President shall be as follows:

1. Attend all general meetings.
2. Coordinate with President all meeting information.
3. Review all old business.
4. Assume President's duties if President is unable to do them.
5. Be responsible for care and custody of all Club property, with an up-to-date written inventory and sign out sheet. Will be responsible for keeping by-laws up-to-date, and providing all new members with a copy that they will sign for.
6. Submit bimonthly article for newsletter.

Section D – Secretary's duties are:

1. Attend all general meetings.
2. Keep minutes of meetings.
3. Read minutes of last meeting.
4. Coordinate information for newsletter.
