

Directions:

From Madison, Janesville & Beloit, WI:

Take I-39 South/I-90 East to Rockford, IL. Note: There is road construction from the WI-IL tollbooth to the I-39 South exit at Rockford. Take the I-39 South exit at Rockford and stay in the right lane-right lane will exit to I-39 South. Stay on I-39 South to Exit 27 at Minonk. After exiting, turn right onto CR2/CR2200N (West). Go West about 7.5 miles and turn Left onto CR13/CR1800E (South). Go South about 7.5 miles to Roanoke. Entering Roanoke, watch for your next Right turn onto West Joseph Street, then make a Left onto North Church Street and then finally a Right turn onto West High Street.


Directions:

From Madison:

Take Hwy 14 East to Evansville. At Evansville, turn right onto E. Main St. then left onto Hwy 213 South/Hwy 59 South. Continue to follow Hwy 213 South towards Beloit until you come to S. Paddock Rd. Turn right onto S. Paddock Rd. to 2604 S. Paddock Rd. (Ruthanne's house will be on your right).

From IL:

Take I-39 North toward Rockford. Take I-39 North/20 East to I-90 West to Beloit. At Beloit, turn onto IL 75 West (Gardner St.) to IL 2 North (State St.). Turn left onto IL 2 North to WI 213 North (4th St.). Turn right onto WI 213 North and follow to WI 81 West (W. Liberty Ave.). Follow WI 81West out of Beloit to Paddock Road. Turn right and go North on S. Paddock Road to 2604 S. Paddock Road (Ruthanne's house will be on your left).
