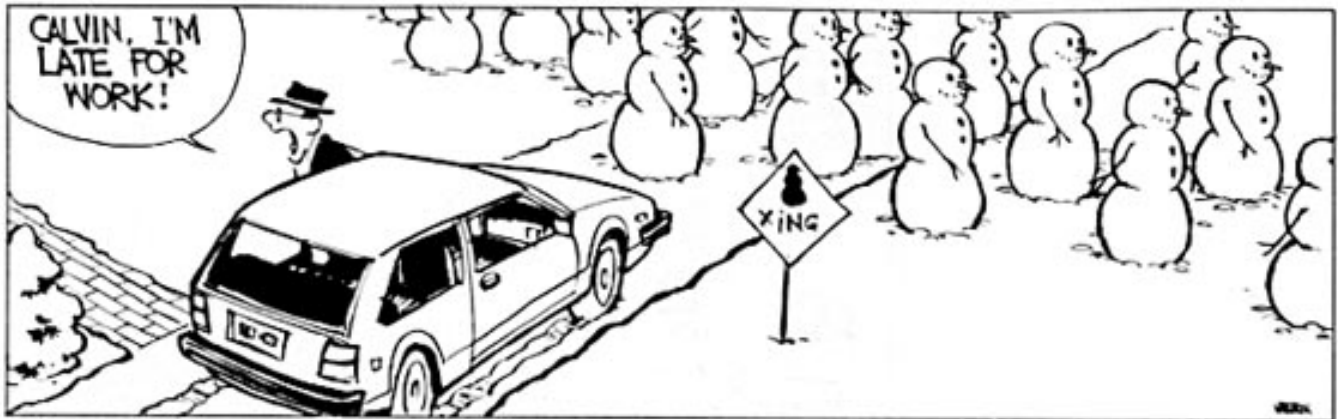

The Next Meeting is January 22nd

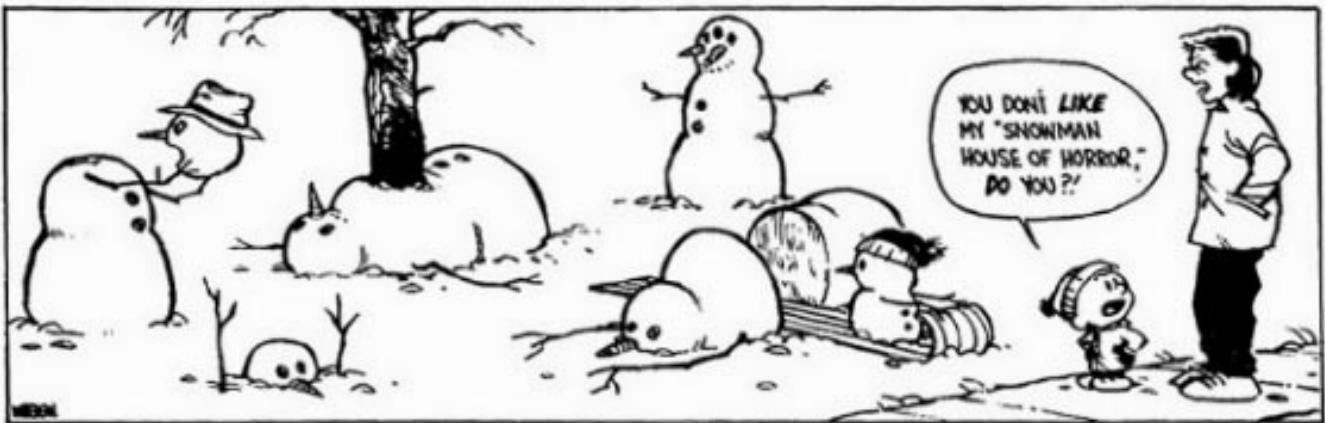

Hands-on success since 1954

Family owned Slack's Jelly Farm has survived tough times in the past

LODI — There are machines out there that can apply a label or secure a cap to a glass jar.

But not at this jelly, jam and salsa operation.

Technology has been slow to arrive at Slack's Jelly Farm, sitting on a hilltop and dead-end road just south of Lake Wisconsin. Since 1954, to supplement income from the farm, the family business has been making spreads for morning toast primarily by hand.

The process, which includes stirring batches with large wooden paddles, has served the Slack family well. Its product lines — sold in grocery and specialty food stores, farm markets and orchards around the Midwest and in their own store — have expanded. The business has endured the economic downturns of the early 1970s and 1980s and, over the past two years, a recession that forced many small businesses, and some larger ones, into closure.

Mark Slack, co-owner, said business has been consistent despite the downturn. "We

haven't moved ahead a lot or lost ground either. We're in the type of market niche that really hasn't been hit by the economy."

That steadiness has allowed the Slacks to replace their antiquated warehouse with a more modern facility, keep production going three days a week and keep the doors to the company store — located in a former

bedroom of the 1857 homestead farmhouse — open six days a week. They are closed on Sundays.

The list of homemade products includes dozens of flavors of jams, jellies, spreadable fruit and fruit butters. There are innovative flavors such as root beer jelly and a line of flavors geared toward tourists. The Wisconsin Wildlife Preserve products include Mosquito Marmalade, Black and Blue Bear-y, Raccoon Razzle-Boozle and Gray Wolf Boysen Grape.

Salsas were added about 15 years ago under the Ol' Snort name, with flavors such as corn and black bean, Bogberry (made with cranberry), apple, cherry and Vidalia onion peach.

"We use good, quality stuff," said co-owner Ethel Slack, 83, Mark Slack's mother. "We don't use any corn syrup or preservatives or fillers. We make it just the way (it's made) at home, with pure cane sugar, not beet (sugar), and you can taste the difference."

Much of the fruit comes from orchards in Washington and Oregon, but peaches, rhubarb and blueberries come from Michigan, and apples and cranberries come from Wisconsin.

A freezer the size of a four-car

garage serves as a storage area for the fruit, which is typically shipped in plastic buckets. Sugar is purchased by the ton, and jars by the thousand.

In 1972, when Ethel Slack first started the business, a truckload of jars cost \$3,000. That price has risen over the years to \$25,000.

Competition also has increased, as more brands battle for shelf space in the grocery aisle and online. The Slacks' products can be found throughout the state and in parts of Michigan, Iowa, Indiana, Illinois and Minnesota.

"We have two very good sales-

men," Ethel Slack said. "They take care of their trucks well and their accounts well."

Local accounts include Janesville-based Woodman's and its 13 stores; Willy Street Co-op in Madison, which is adding a second store in Middleton; Jenifer Street Market and Metcalfe's Market, both in Madison; Paoli Cheese Store in Paoli; Ehlenbach's Cheese Chalet in DeForest; and Mousehouse Cheesehaus in Windsor.

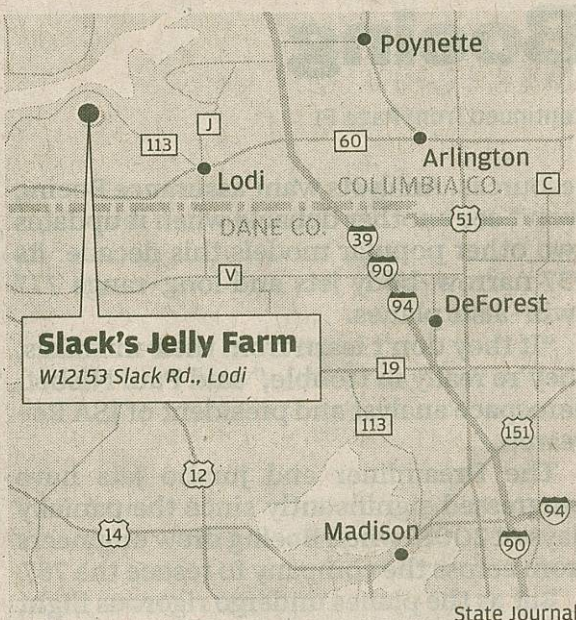

of Ethel's husband, Cecil Slack — used to sell eggs, baked goods and garden produce door-to-door from the trunk of their car to tourists who stayed in cabins around Lake Wisconsin. When they began selling jars of home-canned wild blackberry jam, the response was overwhelming.

At one point, jam and jelly customers used the honor system and dropped money into a small box in a roadside stand outside the house. That sales technique is long gone, but the production process is about the same as it was in 1954 — when Dwight D. Eisenhower was president, Texas Instruments introduced the transistor radio, and the last new episode of the "Lone Ranger" aired on radio.

Ethel and Cecil Slack worked in the business since the early 1960s and took over the operation full time in 1972. Mark Slack, now 56, returned to the family business in 1989 following the death of Cecil.

His duties include making jellies, jams and salsa, developing new recipes, design-



ing labels and managing the business.

One of the company's policies is to buy back any unsold product from vendors. It doesn't happen often but makes for a good working relationship, Mark Slack said.

"Over the years, we've found what will sell and what won't," he said. "We just try not to produce stuff that will be a dog on people's shelves. It doesn't do either one of us any good."

Batches used to be made in 6-gallon kettles over natural-gas burners, but most of the production now is done with 40-gallon boilers, which make enough to fill 500 half-pint jars. The mixture is stirred by hand and then transferred into kettles, where it is poured into a large funnel that feeds the product into jars. Lids are then screwed on and labels applied by hand before being hand-packed into boxes.

On a good day, 2,500 half-pint jars can be produced. Spreads sell from \$3.95 to \$6.95 a jar, and salsa, \$4.59 to \$7.95 a jar.

"People want a good product," Ethel Slack said. "It's a quality product. You can taste the fruit, not just the sugar."

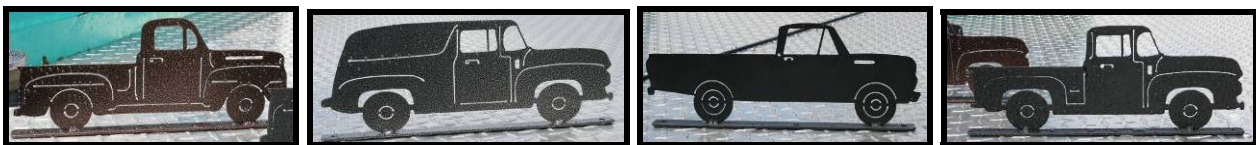

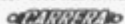
