The November Meeting Minutes

Badgerland F-100's Truck Club

The meeting was held on Saturday, November 1st, at the Bob and Jane Meyer residence in Waukesha. We met in Bob's nice new garage where he stores and maintains his 1955 F-100. The meeting was called to order by President Mike Connor at 11:34am. Present were ten members and 3 classic Ford trucks.

Vice President's Report:

Rick expressed his thanks to everyone who participated and helped put on Dash 25. All agreed that it was an outstanding success. Even the rain on Friday during the cruise did not dampen the enthusiasm of the many participants.

Rick passed around newsletters from other clubs for review by our members.

Secretary's Report:

Motion made by Jim Krueger to accept the minutes as written in the last newsletter. Seconded by Marlene Rogers. Motion passed.

Treasurers Report:

Chris reported the balance for the club checking account. Most of the expenses associated with Dash 25 have been paid however, Great Wolf has not yet provided an invoice for the room used for registration so that bill is still outstanding. There were record sales for T shirts and sweat shirts. Additional expenses incurred for Dash 25 included \$400 for the DJ and the cost of the registration room. Also there were approximately 75 more people served for lunch than what was originally planned which cost another additional \$400. The deposit that was provided to the vendor for the boat ride that did not occur has been returned to the club.

If this winner claims the prize then the club will owe \$1,000.00 towards that prize. The winner is responsible for any shipping costs.

The November Meeting Minutes

Old Business:

Mike opened up discussion on Dash 25. He reported that registrations were above and beyond what was anticipated with a total registration of 117 and many of those were day of the show. There were just under 300 people that went through the lunch line. There were some concerns expressed regarding the pace of the lunch line but with use of a vendor for lunch, the vendor is required to serve (portion control).

The process of having a DJ give away the smaller door prizes seemed to work well as it did not overlap into the time used to present trophies. Overall there was only positive feedback on Dash 25.

There was further discussion on making available more styles of shirts and jackets with the club logo. The current vendor who prints our shirts, Leisure Threads would be willing to print logos on a variety of styles of shirts but we would have to provide him the shirts and or jackets to be printed on. Mike and Chris have looked into different brands of work shirts available at local retailers but have found them to be cost prohibitive. Chris encourages members to let her know if they come across a shirt or jacket that they would like printed with the club logo.

New Business:

A discussion was held regarding using Great Wolf again for next year for Dash 26. Mike reported that to have all the arrangements in place on time for Dash 26, the contact would need to be signed sometime this coming January. Following discussion of the pros and cons of continued use of Great Wolf a motion was made by Bob Meyer to pursue a contract with Great Wolf for Dash 26. Seconded by Chuck Rogers. Motion passed.

Other Business:

It was reported in the last newsletter (August) that the Show Me F100's club will no longer be sponsoring a show, however Mike reports that Show Me club member Jim Wagner is going to continue the tradition of the Branson show and will be organizing and hosting his own show with the help of other former Show Me members. This show will be held on the weekend of July 11^{th,} 2015 in Branson, Missouri. This new show will be based on somewhat of the same format used by Badgerland F-100's with homemade trophies and a family atmosphere. For those interested in a possible trip to Branson estimated mileage is 660 one way.

Mike passed around a flyer on trouble shooting power brakes and a second flyer listing the upcoming national level shows for 2015.

WHAT TO DO IF YOU CAN'T GET A PEDAL

If you can't get a pedal PLEASE PERFORM THESE TESTS.

THE MOST COMMON REASONS FOR A POOR BRAKE PEDAL:

- 1. The bleeder screws on the calipers are not facing up.
- 2. The master cylinder was not bench bled or was not bled completely.
- 3. Defective rebuilt master cylinder with pitted cylinder bore or defective pressure seals.
- 4. Master cylinder bore size too small for the system volume requirements.
- 5. Use of a disc/drum master for a 4 wheel disc system.
- 6. Master cylinder lower than the calipers or wheel cylinders.
- 6. Lines or components near a heat source.
- 7. Lines that loop up higher than the master cylinder and then come back down will trap air.
- 8. Low drag metric calipers without the use of a quick take up master cylinder.
- 9. No residual valve to rear drum brakes.
- 10. Drum brake wheel cylinders too large.
- 11. Silicone brake fluid (it can tend to trap air and cause seals to swell).
- 12. Rear caliper parking brake / pistons not set properly with a rear disc system.
- 13. Rear calipers not being bled properly. Most brake problems with four wheel disc cars come from the rear.
- 14. Improper pedal adjustment with too much free play.
- 15. Old or inferior quality brake hoses.

HOW TO PROPERLY DIAGNOSE A BRAKE PROBLEM:

If you have very poor brakes, a spongy pedal or no pedal at all you will have to do some diagnostics to determine where the problem is in your braking system. Is it in the master cylinder, the front brakes or the rear brakes? These tests assume that your system is properly installed and bled. Perform these simple tests to find where the problem is. Once you know where the problem is it will be much easier to fix.

- 1. Disconnect the brake lines from the master cylinder while leaving it on the vehicle.
- 2. Obtain solid tapered plugs for the master cylinder outlets with the correct thread pitch. These are available at any good automotive auto parts store. You may also use our supplied bleeder kit.
- 3. Plug the master cylinder outlets. Step on the pedal and hold pressure for about 30 seconds. If the pedal remains firm then the master cylinder is good. If the pedal sinks to the floor then the cylinder is bad.
- 4. If the master cylinder is fine, connect the line to the front brakes. If the pedal remains firm then the problem is not coming from the front brakes. If the pedal sinks to the floor or is excessively spongy then the problem is with the front brakes.
- 5. Connect the rear and if the pedal goes bad then the problem is in the rear.

You may also check whether your lack of a pedal comes from the front or the rear quickly this way. If you are sure the master cylinder is good, clamp off the front rubber hoses and try the pedal. If you get a good pedal then you know the problem is from the front calipers. Be very careful not to damage the hoses and try to protect them from damage by placing the hose between something smooth. There is a special tool sold in auto parts stores for this purpose. Try it on the rear if the front is fine.

IF YOU HAVE A GOOD PEDAL BUT YOUR CAR WILL NOT STOP YOU MUST OBTAIN PRESSURE READINGS AT THE MASTER CYLINDER AND THE FRONT AND REAR WHEELS


HOW TO OBTAIN A PRESSURE READING

Take your vehicle to a good repair or brake specialty shop. Most good shops will have a pressure tester. Disc brakes minimum pressure: 800 psi. Drum brakes minimum pressure: 400 psi.
