## A Little History:

We recently came across something our member, Dave Kerznar had written back in 1995, that tells a bit about how the Badgerland F-100's came into being. We thought it would be interesting to put a copy of this in the newsletter. Keep in mind, this was written about 22 years go, but does give a good history of how our club started out.

### HISTORY OF THE BADGERLAND F-100'S TRUCK CLUB

Where does one begin with a history of this club or even attempt a history unless you start at the beginning and work to the present day. **Mike Connor** our present day **president** purchased a 1956 F-100 in 1976 and to a certain extent planted the seed of this club. Over the next few years Mike worked at fixing up that truck, which by the way is the same truck he is driving today. Over those years he started collecting names of other Ford F-100 owners and when he finished that truck went to the **1986 F-100 SUPERNATIONAL'S in Gattlinburg Tennessee**. Where in, comes into play another influence to our club, **David J. Kerznar**. David in 1983 purchased a 1954 F-100 and wanted to fix it up as a "daily driver". David spent a lot of time looking for other trucks and truckers to get idea's and accidentally ran across TRUCKIN' magazine on the news stand and purchased a copy. He found it a good source of info on the **Ford F-100**. He was looking for a local club to join but found none. The closest was **TRI-STATE in OHIO**, so he joined and they were an extremely helpful with all his questions. The big club event for TRI-State F-100 was going to the **1986 F-100 SUPERNATIONAL'S**. So David with his two kids, Adam and Jessica went to Gattlinburg, taking a camera and lots of paper for notes and not enough money. While there, he ran into Mike and Chris Connor.

He saw that Mike's truck had **WISCONSIN** plates, so he asked him if there was a **WISCONSIN AREA FORD F-100 TRUCK CLUB**. He stated: "NO" but he had some names as did David, so within a few months they were working on setting up the first letter writing campaign to see if there was interest in a Club in **WISCONSIN**. With some help of Marv's OLD TIME Auto Parts and their list of F-100 parts purchaser's, a survey was sent. With the responses it appeared there was interest in forming A FORD TRUCK CLUB. After lots of behinds the scenes work by Mike, the club became official on March 11, 1989. It was called BADGERLAND F-100'S TRUCK CLUB LTD. At the first meeting officers were voted on by the people that were present. I recall it went well, in that we set our dues at \$15.00 per year. With five persons present that had the cash, we immediately started out with five members. Four were voted in as officers. They were:

Those four officers remained in those positions until the 1995 elections. That fifth person to join at that first meeting day was Dan Sage, who is still a member in good standing.

The first few meeting were held at Capital Ford and later on moved on to different members homes. It took almost a year to get

organized but four concepts were going to make this truck club different than other clubs:

1. To get as many F-1 and F-100's as possible on the road.
2. To restore or modify and use them safely.
3. To have fun with those trucks and have fun working on them.
4. To make this club a FAMILY organization.

The first year was fun in that we immediately set out to establish a Mid-West Truck Run. In our first year we came up with **DASH TO THE DELLS**. With less than twenty members, we got the TWIN CITIES F-100's Club to join us and we had almost 50 trucks show up. Without a lot of help from everyone, it could have been a disaster. But with great weather, food, events and family fun the CLUB did well. That event brought in more members and we appeared to be on a roll and established as a Ford truck club. That first year we also established a newsletter calling it **"FAT FENDERS FLYER"**. A new position of membership chairperson was also established and both were handled by the vice president. Later when those jobs became in-them-selves extensive, two new elected positions were established.

Each year more members were added and more trucks were being completed. Some members, like David Kerznar, Daryl Fedkenheuer and Ron Scholl's just took a little longer than most of the members. Matter of fact, Ron Scholl's was having so much trouble with his truck, he purchased another truck just so he wouldn't get the **PHANTOM TRUCK AWARD** for the SECOND YEAR in a row at the annual Badgerland Winter Banquet. This is an end of the year event where one club members can poke fun at other members. Of course, all done in good taste and in good fun with a great meal and bench racing, until the cows come home. Several awards were established at the winter banquet that are voted on by the membership. They are **MEMBER OF THE YEAR, TRUCK OF THE YEAR, MOST IMPROVED TRUCK OF THE YEAR, STOCK TRUCK OF THE YEAR AND CUSTOM TRUCK OF THE YEAR**. Later on a sixth award called **THE FAMILY AWARD** was added to emphasize the concept of **FORD and FAMILY**.

Several members took Ron's advise and got into owning **multiple** trucks craze with The Morgan brothers, leading the way with **"OVER 10 TRUCKS"**. The Meysembourg's followed with **six**, and the Mahloch's with **four**. The Connor's, Showers', Sonn's, Herchenbach's, Koeshall's, Master's, Mohr's, Mullennix's, and Randy Roelke's following with **two** trucks - to name just a few.

Members started helping other members, and the word spread with the club continuing to grow across state lines. **Wisconsin** presently leads with **over 60 memberships**. **Illinois** comes in with **over 15**. Other states that have **BADGERLAND MEMBERSHIPS** are

Minnesota with six and Iowa with two. Other states that have BADGERLAND MEMBERS are Michigan, Tennessee, Oregon, Arizona, Mississippi and Louisiana.

A history can not be complete with out mentioning our member from Louisiana, Bernard Soileau. Bernard is one avid F-100 who is putting together a 56 F-100 panel. We became aware of Bernard through an article in Truckin' magazine. After corresponding with him and trying to assist him via the phone, letter and monetarily, we're hoping that in 1995 Barnard will make it to our six annual DASH TO THE DELLS in Wisconsin Dells in September. It appears based on his efforts and tenacity HE WILL MAKE THIS YEARS DASH!!!

Each year we continued to add in membership and activities, until today in 1995, we are almost 100 FAMILIES strong and growing. I am very pleased to state that this club, that was going to be different, continues to **INCREASE ITS MEMBERSHIP RANKS EACH YEAR, and has NEVER INCREASED ITS DUES OR DASH FEES SINCE THE FOUNDING OF THE CLUB.**

In 1995, it became time for Mike and Theresa Sonn and David J. Kerznar to step down and turn over the reigns of their position to new officers. With **Todd Showers as Vice President and Paul Zeien as Secretary**, this club will continue in good hands making sure that we follow the **club motto of "FORD, FUN and FAMILY"** into the coming years.



#2) 360 FE engine with recent rebuild puking oil into coolant (no coolant in oil) I would assume it is otherwise mechanically sound.

C6 long wheel base (fixed yoke), good operational condition, still attached to the motor.

9" rear axle, 3.5:1 (from a '68) poor condition, sloppy input shaft. Otherwise not bad, never seen salt.

Front suspension in poor condition, needs kingpins and bushings, otherwise very clean, no rust.

Complete cab and hood from 1970- front drivers side mount is rusted out and some holes in floor pan/rockers but pretty good condition.

In cab gas tank, same. no leaks, CA emissions tubes.

Both doors in good shape, various hardware

Hood is dented but relatively rust free.

1970 grille with some damage, passenger side headlight bezel

Complete 1970 ranger interior, shabby but trim in good condition

Windshield trim ring (excellent cond)

Drip rail trim ring (excellent cond)

Back window glass, solid.

The frame has been cut off ahead of the axle to make room in my garage but if someone wants any parts of it to repair crash damage, or any of the brackets i would be happy to cut parts off for folks.

4 mismatch wheels and tires- hold air and generally roadworthy but i wouldn't go real far on them. Maybe good for a project or the paint booth.

I've parted out the complete 70 truck and I'm transferring parts onto my '68. I'm trying to break even off selling some of the very clean/valuable parts, trim etc. but everything else the price is inverse to how much room it's taking up in my garage. The bigger the part, the more I want it gone! Prices figure somewhere north of scrap and south of eBay, probably closer to scrap.

Anything listed or not listed that you need, give me a call, doesn't hurt to ask. Also may be willing to trade for some things I need, a 28 spline posi in good/rebuildable condition, motorcycle/dirt bike parts and projects, 16 inch 5 lug steelies.

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
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
