What Are You Working On:

Boxing Your Frame - By Chuck Rogers

OK, so since I didn't get an article from anybody working on their truck, so I'll bore you with another one of my own. This time it will be on how to box your frame (or at least how I did mine) for strength. As you can see by the photos there was a lot of extra stuff on the frame that I didn't need & wouldn't be using with a modern Ford V-8. Then there were a lot of holes that the rust created from sitting for many years in tall grass that holds moisture in.

I repaired all the holes first, by cutting them out with a die grinder & used the cut-out piece as a template. I cut out the new piece & welded them in. After welding the holes up, I found the frame still weaker than I wanted it, so I got some more metal from the scrap yard & cut out pieces that followed the frame curves & tack welded them in to make sure everything fit before welding them in place. I also mocked up the rack & pinion & rear end as well as making a couple of new & slightly modified cross member supports. I ended up using Ranger spring hangers & springs from a fairly late model Ranger (all from a wrecking yard). If anybody is working on a frame and needs more photos covering more things just let me know, I have more.

Lazy Day Crock Pot Lasagna Recipe

Prep Time – 5 Minutes Cook Time – 4 Hours

Ingredients

- · 1 bag of frozen cheese ravioli (25 oz)
- · 1 lb of ground beef, browned
- · 3 cans of crushed tomatoes (14 or 15 oz each)
- · 1 tablespoon of Italian Seasoning
- 1 tablespoon of Garlic Salt
- · 4 cups of mozzarella cheese
- · ½ cup parmesan cheese (optional)

Instructions

- 1. In a large skillet brown the beef completely and drain off any remaining fat.
- 2. Stir in all the cans of tomatoes, and seasonings.
- 3. In a 6 quart crock pot, cover the bottom with some of the sauce.
- 4. Then place a layer of ravioli across the bottom.
- 5. Then place a layer of the mozzarella cheese.
- 6. Continue this until all the meat sauce and the ravioli is used.
- 7. You want to end with the meat sauce on top.
- 8. Then top with the leftover mozzarella cheese and add the parmesan cheese on top (completely optional).
- 9. Cook on low for 4 hours.
- 10. Turn off and let it sit for about 15 minutes before you serve. Cut and serve. Serve with your favorite side salad and crusty garlic bread.


