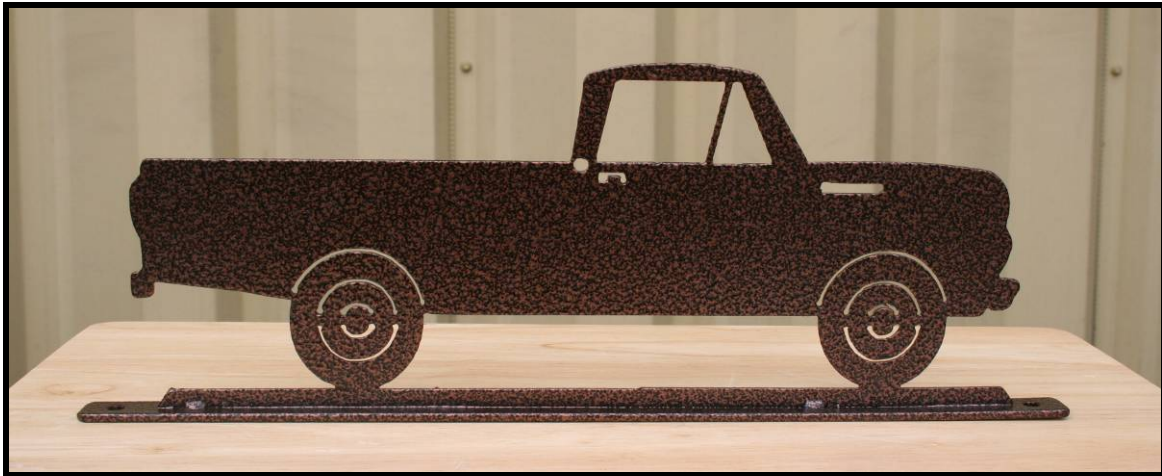

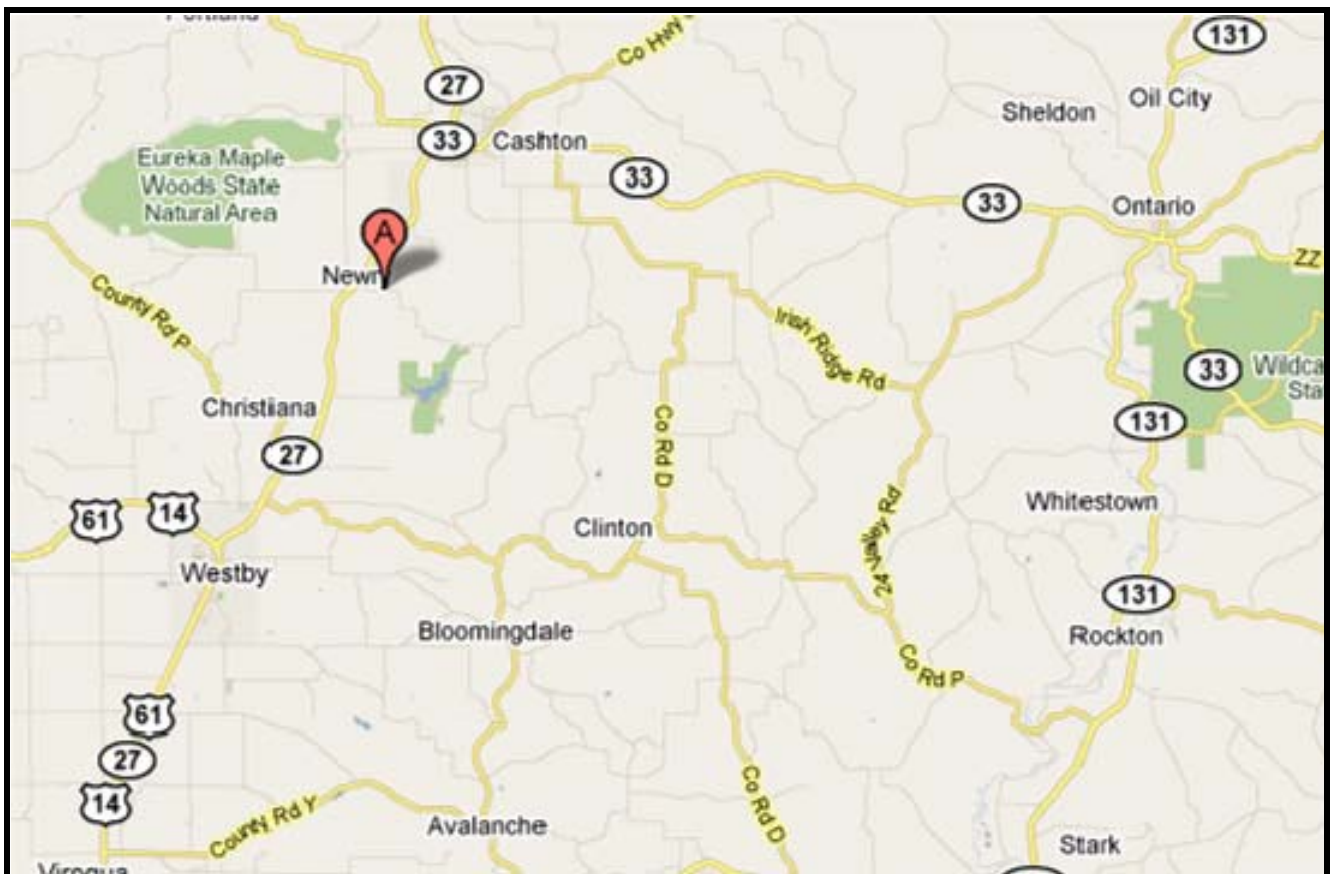
The Next Meeting

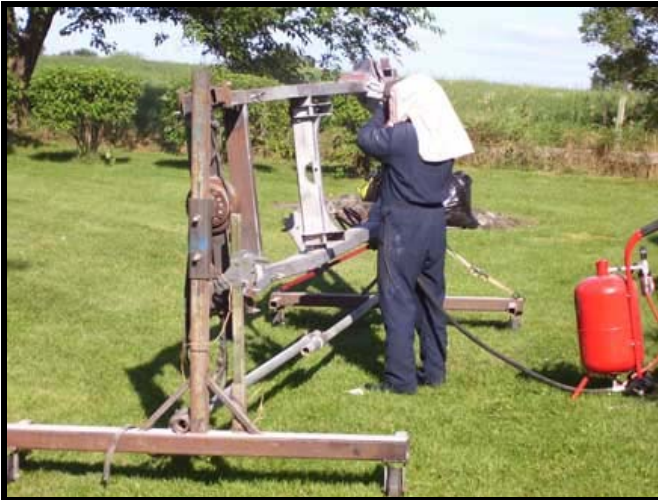

This was the hard part. All the weight of the panel, from the wheel wells back rest on these two spots. One on each side. This view is looking back at the rear splash pan. From under the panel. This support connects to the 2 above patch panels. It also supports the door strikers.



The cleco in the picture on left supports the piece of metal in the right picture. This is the same area as picture #4, "Rear door opening". (3/16/10)

I thought that the above left patch panel was going to be tough, but now I believe that it is going to be the easy one. It is sandblasted so all the thin metal is gone. Should be a piece of cake! Yeah Right! Keep working on them and driving them. Stop on in when you're in the area! You're all welcome!
