### A Note From Bob

Just a few words of thanks to the Badgerland F-100's Truck Club for another terrific Dash to the Dells. I appreciate all the hard work that goes into making the show happen year after year. And it was great to have Rick & Lisa and group prepare the lunch again this year. Everything tasted super!

This year, during the show, I was the recipient of help from Dale Barrette. After several unsuccessful attempts to install a new ignition key cylinder lock into the steering column of my '54, I remembered to bring the lock cylinder to the Dells with me to see if Dale could help. After we had lunch, Dale spent the better part of an hour working on the steering column. Initially, Dale was surprised to find the old cylinder really didn't want to come out of the steering column. As he plied his trade, I mentioned that maybe I could live with having only one key for the truck. After a few more moments he removed the old cylinder, much to my relief. But the next part of the adventure occurred when the new key cylinder won't seat inside the steering column. Dale looked at the end of the old cylinder and noticed some burring on the leading portion of the lock. Now what would we do?

The ignition is in the "ON" position in order to remove the cylinder and Dale found he could rotate (with a screwdriver) the ignition switch rod from Start to Run, but not to Off. So after I retrieved two small screwdrivers the club was giving away Dale went to work. His surgery used the two screwdrivers to remove the snap ring, a retaining plate and the gear that operated the rod to the column mounted ignition switch. Once he had the gear out, he used a small file I had to clean the rectangular bore of the gear. Now the new cylinder slid into the gear. Hurray!!!

Dale installed the gear and new cylinder into the column and provided instructions for installing the retaining plate and a new snap ring when I got back home. A REALLY BIG thanks to Dale Barrette for changing the ignition key cylinder for me. Dale continues to support the club's charter of keeping our trucks on the road and running.




